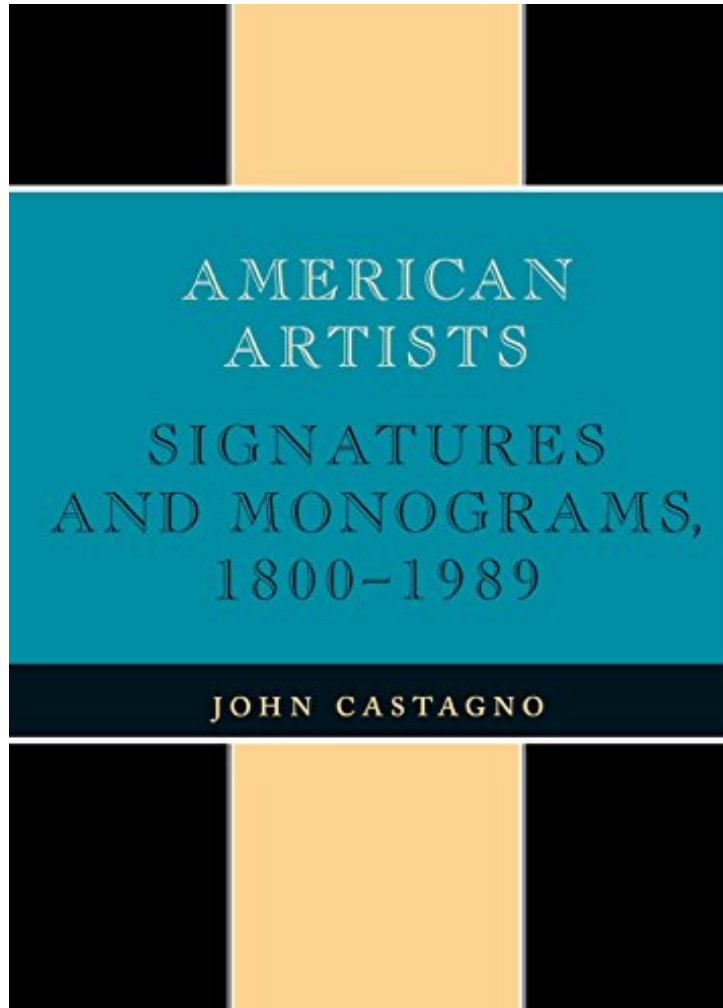

With 600 listings of prominent Canadian and Latin American artists, and 900 listings of
