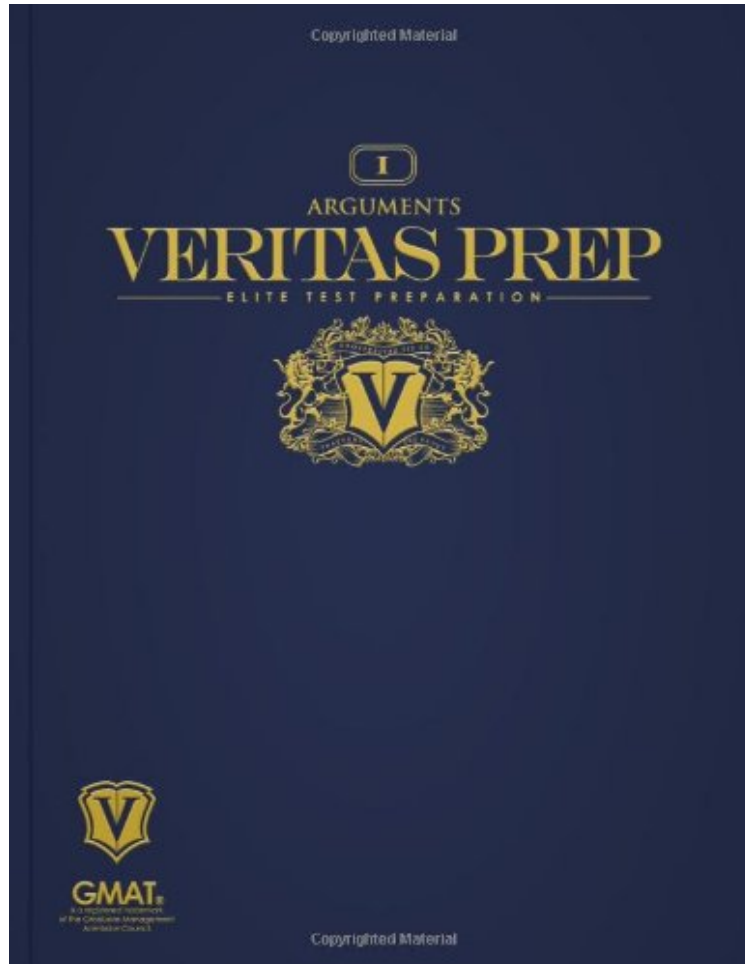

The book explains the right logical thinking that is needed to correctly interpret the problems on the GMAT. However, I do find the \$30 price tag for this thin, 46-page book outrageous. I bought it used, and paid around \$6. I think \$10 is the maximum price anyone should pay for this little booklet. The value of the book would be right, if either the price is considerably reduced, or the content is significantly enhanced. As mentioned, the idea of preparing a student for the GMAT mindset is a good one. The book could have covered more areas to do this job better. For example, it could explain typical pitfalls and blind spots GMAT implements in its problems etc. Right now, the only takeaway from the book is that "test taker needs to understand the basics of the formal logic, to correctly interpret the GMAT problems". I would certainly not pay \$30 to

It probably makes most sense once you see how it's directly useful to your approach to a lot of the more high-level GMAT problems after studying those problems, but I still recommend reading it first and then going back to it again once you've dove into the GMAT more. It should really be called GMAT Zen or something since it's the only GMAT book I've seen that takes such a 30,000 foot look at the test. It's definitely not enough on its own, but works as a perfect complement to other books that offer more direct strategies.
