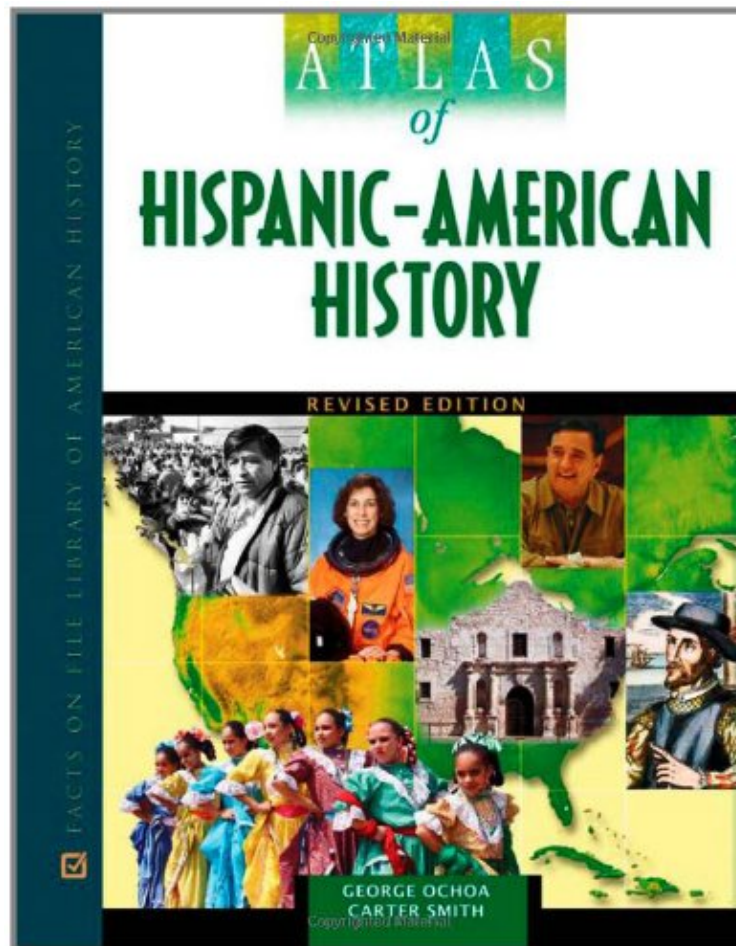

Approximately 25 pages of new material present information about Hispanic Americans in popular culture, as well as a discussion of NAFTA and the debate over illegal immigration. New color charts and graphics explore these issues, and updated statistics are featured throughout. Elsewhere, the changes are primarily cosmetic: cleaner fonts, a more sophisticated graphic design, and pull quotes in the margins. What hasn't changed is the quality of the chronologically arranged content. This edition builds on the well-organized structure of the original to provide easily accessible information on the vast array of peoples and influences that make up Hispanic-American history, from the first Spanish contact in the New World to today's Hispanic-American pop stars.
