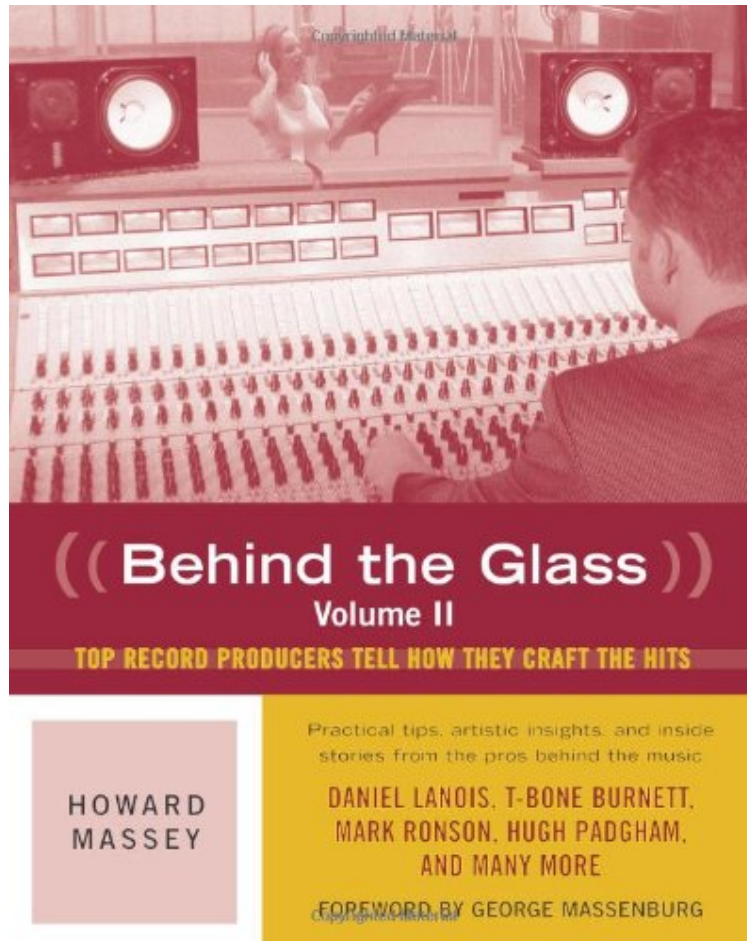

The learning curve on computer based recording and the general public's taste in music had me somewhat frustrated. I was about 7 pages into this book when I found myself

regaining my vision and confidence. It was good to know that some of the industry pros think like I do, and value dynamics over the sheer volume of some of today's recording. Some of the incredibly expensive equipment that they so casually refer to is beyond the reach of most home recordists, but there are a lot of basic tips here in a variety of areas, and some of their unconventional approaches to recording are fascinating.
