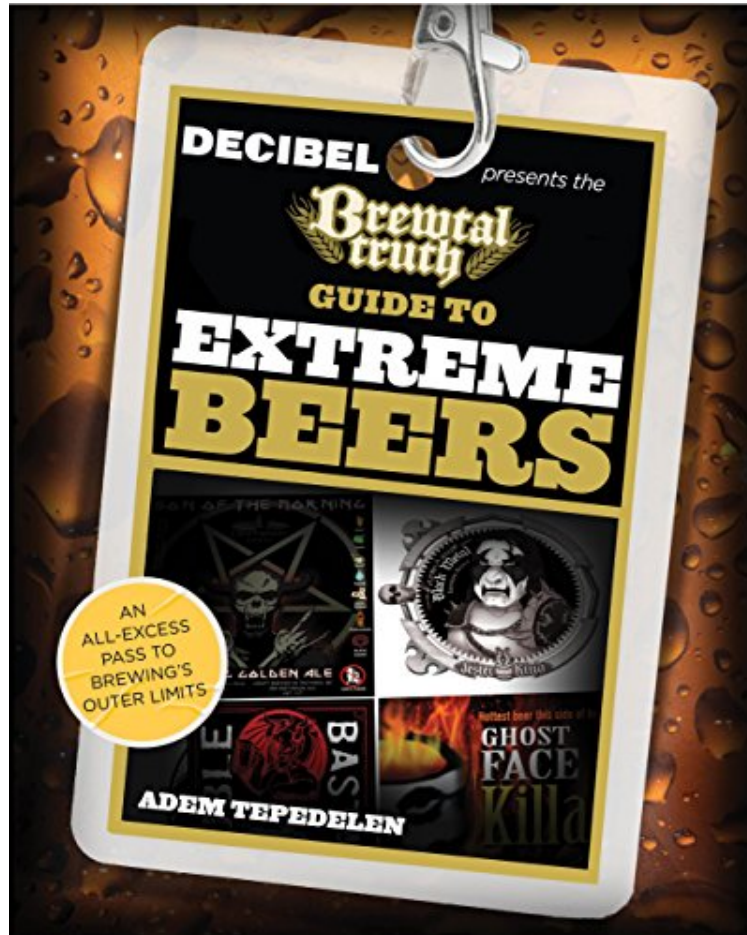

MulloyIn this book Adam Tepedelen combines his love for extreme beer and music by examining the interface between extreme beer and extreme music. He divides extreme beer into six categories with a chapter on each beers using unusual ingredients, those with extremely high alcohol, hop bombs, brews with devilish names, beers that improve with age, and brews inspired by heavy metal bands. Each chapter profiles several examples for each category and for each beer reviewed he recommends a heavy metal song or group. He finishes the chapter with interviews with a brewer and a musician and an interesting sidebar. The beer descriptions are good and show that he has actually imbibed the beer he is

The Brewtal Truth Guide to Extreme Beers is the first guide of its type, defining what makes certain craft beers extremely extreme, featuring descriptions and ratings of more than a 100 of the most insane beers in the world broken down into a handful of specific categories. These are outrageous brews with unusual ingredients, ridiculously high alcohol by volume (ABV), bizarre names and sometimes unsettling flavors. Appealing to casual and serious beer drinkers alike, the book is the perfect gift for the adventurous guy (or girl) who's always looking for new experiences; the book is a reference guide and a challenge all at once.
