In fact, it made me step back and reassess my own career, pull out my resume and tweak it too. When the idea of writing a review for Quentin Schultze's latest book How to Write Powerful College Student Resumes Cover Letters came to me, I was more than a little hesitant. It's not because of the author. Of all of my required readings in college, Dr. Q's book Redeeming Television was my favorite. It was the topic that put me in the wrong frame of mind. Reading a book about resumes isn't my first choice for leisure activities; but I accepted the challenge. Before I was finished with the first sentence, though, I was enjoying it more than most other self-help books I've read in the past.
